## April Exhibit Talks were given by five members

- 1.) George M. (\$1.00 Bar) a 1.5 oz. "One Dollar Bar" Milk Chocolate with Roasted Almonds wrapped in a dollar lookalike wrapper.
- 2.) Rick A. (Large Silver Coins of the World) three pieces from European countries over 64 mm and 80+ grams with the book "Large Silver Coins of the World".
- 3.) Dan U. (Staplers) telling of the development (the first modern stapler, 1877) and different parts of this important tool for numismatists displaying coins.
- 4.) Steve D'I. (Type Pieces) Steve continuing with his U. S. type set had shown a toned 1842 dime and an 1837 reeded edge half dollar.
- 5.) Steve R. (1915 PPIE) history of the 100th anniversary of the Panama-Pacific International Exposition celebrating the completion of the Panama Canal. The commemorative coins to mark the occasion: a silver half dollar, a gold dollar and quarter eagle, and the impressive pair of gold pieces, (3,000 fifty-dollar coins) half were round and the other half octagonal.
