## 2017 COLORADO SPRINGS COIN, CURRENCY AND COLLECTIBLES SHOW

For many years, the Colorado Springs' Numismatic Society and Coin Club jointly conducted our local coin show and watched it become a nationally respected event. We can be proud of that accomplishment. The volunteers from our two local clubs are essential to its success and profitability. It is held in conjunction with the ANA Summer Seminar and this year's dates are WEDNESDAY, JUNE 21 – SATURDAY, JUNE 24.

Last year both clubs transferred ownership of the coin show to Ken Byrd, who was heavily involved with past shows. The clubs retained an important stake and commitment to continue providing volunteer assistance in exchange for a portion of the show's proceeds. The proceeds from the show fund the refreshments at our meetings and the many prizes that are awarded during the year, also allowing us to keep the club dues low.

Name tags are issued to Volunteers that allow you on the bourse floor during early bird times and look snazzy with any wardrobe. Volunteers are also entered in the monthly Volunteer Prize drawings. Volunteer sign-up sheets will be available at both club meetings for the following duties:

Deliver cases from ANA warehouse to the Expo Center on North Nevada on Tuesday, June 20, and return the cases to ANA on Saturday, June 24

Set up tables, chairs, cases, lamps and extension cords on Wednesday; Tear down on Saturday

Staff the Dealer Registration Table on Wednesday, 21 June

Staff the Registration/Welcome Table at the show entrance. We need two volunteers on duty at all times

Manage Raffle ticket sales and prizes at the club's information tables Provide numismatic exhibits and run the exhibit area

If the clubs take charge of delivering, setting up, and returning the cases (along with the other volunteering we have always done) we will receive the profit from the case rentals. A raffle will replace the door prizes of past years and provide a source of income for the clubs. We just need to take care of the raffle sales, prizes, and keep up with the proceeds.

It is important to remember that this is a transitional year and many dealers will base their future participation in this show on how well the clubs maintain or exceed our past performance.

SHOW your support for the Society and Club - mark your calendars now for JUNE 21 – JUNE 25. Enjoy the camaraderie of volunteering with fellow members. Spend some time on the bourse floor.

Thanks to Ken Byrd's promotion of the show, we expect over 200 tables so there will be an abundance of Coins, Currency and Collectibles for your perusal.
