FOR DISCUSSION UNDER NEW BUSINESS:

55th Anniversary of Colorado Springs Numismatic Society Commemorative Medal

Have you noticed that the coin image at the top of the page on our CSNS newsletters in from the 50th Anniversary medal that Dan Carr (Moonlight Mint) struck for us?

I recently realized that this year CSNS turns 55 years old. That gives us the opportunity to strike another medal and it is also just in time for the ANA National Money show here in Colorado Springs, co-hosted by our 2 clubs. That would be a perfect venue to sell extra coins that are not purchased by members. The 50yth anniversary coin was a great fund raiser for us before and could be again. But with half the year gone we have to move quickly, so I have a couple of questions for our August 8 meeting:

1. Do you support a 55th anniversary medal for the Colorado Springs Numismatic Society?
2. If so, do you have any ideas for a design or theme for the medal? [perhaps a coin that was in circulation 55 years ago in 1966? or in 1921? 55 double die even comes to mind]
3. The Moonlight Mint design costs ranges from \$200 for the most simple, \$1600 to replicate an existing coin or up to \$200 for more intricate designs.
Engraving depends on the size of the coin. Silver dollars are crown size at 38mm cost \$650 to engrave. Half dollars are roughly 30-31mm which costs \$550. The smaller the coin the less expensive to engrave. So how much should be budgeted for the design and engraving?
