## **MINUTES of the FEBRUARY 11, 2024 Meeting of the COLORADO SPRINGS NUMISMATIC SOCIETY**

The meeting was held at the Gold Hill Police Station Community Room and called to order by President Steve D. with 17 members present and 1 guest in attendance who inquired about different types of coins, especially "error coins".

Secretary's Report, was given which consisted of the Minutes of the January 2024 meeting contained in the February 2024 newsletter. The Treasurer gave his report and a motion was made to accept both the Secretary and the Treasurer reports and approval of both reports was given by membership.

### **OLD BUSINESS**

2024 DUES – CSNS is now collecting 2024 membership dues. Dues are \$10 for individuals, \$5 for Yn's ( Young Numismatists are those under the age of 18 ) and \$20 for a Family (all adults and children in the immediate family). Just a reminder.....if you're mailing in your dues, please use the current mailing address which is CSNS, P.O. Box 60404, Colorado Springs, CO 80960.

*(Constitution (By Laws). Discussion on this topic was made that perhaps some parts of it will need to be re-addressed & maybe some changes to be made to it at some time later on.*

Our Treasurer is continuing to get some information about the club's ability to put some money into a CD.

President Steve presented a bill for "Certificate Covers" that were used for our 2023 Christmas Party. This bill was in the amount of \$25.31. Motion was made to accept it and approval was given by membership for payment.

Wayne (Treasurer) presented a bill for \$150.00 which was for "gift cards" that were given out at our 2023 Christmas Party. Motion was made to accept it and approval was given by membership for payment.

George M. presented a bill for monthly club expenses for Oct. 2023 in the amount of \$55.00 & for Nov. 2023 in the amount of \$ 61.00 for a total of \$116.00. Motion was made to accept it and approval was given by membership for payment.

## NEW BUSINESS

ANA "MONEY SHOW": Volunteers may still be needed for both the club table as well as on the bourse floor. Broadmoor parking garage will be available again as it was the last time. Your parking expenses will be reimbursed by the club; however, you must present your parking receipt for that reimbursement. Barbara who is Treasurer of CSCC will be in charge of those reimbursements. George M. will be doing a "Treasure Box" again this year at the club table. The "box" will be available to the children on Friday and George will probably be at the table to handle it on Saturday. This "Treasure Box" containing a variety of coins has been used at previous coin shows for children to reach in and get a coin. Members are encouraged to donate different coins for this project.

2024 SPRINGS COIN SHOW: Barbara gave an update on the 2024 Springs Coin Show to be held June 21 & 22, 2024 at the Elks Lodge. Approximately 26 dealers have responded with their contracts and payments. It is expected that all tables will be sold. Volunteers will be needed for set-up, take-down, registration, etc. As we get closer to the date, more detailed information will be given out.

CSNS Summer Party: This would be a fun get-together for CSNS members. Some suggestions that were made included a "Pizza Party", "Bring-a-Dish" meal, or a "Cook-out" perhaps at Bear Creek Park. This event would probably be sometime during the summer....maybe in July. There was some further discussion about this Summer Party that it would most likely be at Bear Creek Park which does have a pavilion. There's also, on Wednesday evenings, some music. Probably, to reserve a date & time, Parks & Recreation would have to be contacted

## EXHIBITS

- 1) George M. spoke about the Historical Society of the Pikes Peak Region "So-Called Dollars and the Pike Medals. The Pike medals were 250 bronze, 4500 silver and some were dipped in gold. The first 25 were numbered. Approximately, 4200 were discovered in 1955. The commemorative shows Pikes Peak on one side and Zebulon Pike on the other side.
- 2) Steve D. showed a 1904 Liberty Head double eagle in PCGS MS65+ with a CAC green bean from his type set. 1904 happens to be the most common year of the entire series which makes it ideal for a type set, provided of course it's in a high grade.
- 3) Wayne W. displayed a 1979 Susan B. Anthony dollar coin that was one of a "wide brim" variety and a 1979 Susan B. Anthony dollar coin that was a regular one and showed a \$1 Federal Reserve Note where the plate number was incorrectly placed on the bill and he also displayed 2 Liberty dollars.

- 4) Bob C. displayed & spoke about the 2008 American Buffalo Gold Proof 4-Coin Set. The buffalo is .999 gold from the West Point Mint. The design is based on the original buffalo nickel 1913-1938. The obverse profiles a Native American. The 4-coin set contains 1.85 almost pure gold. Also, this set was only a one-year mintage in 2008.

Note: Larry F. volunteers at the ANA Museum. He brought some copies of paperwork dated from the 1970's of both clubs...CSNS & CSCC, showing names of club officers and events going on during that time. Members viewed these items and found them interesting.
