February Exhibit Talks were given by six members

- 1.) George M. (Exhibitor's Medal) a 1904 bronze Louisiana Purchase Exposition medal
- 2.) Gerome W. (Early Territory Map) an 1865 Nebraska Territory map telling history and showing areas that were not yet divided up into the states that they are today.
- 3.) Terry Cl. (Lincoln / Kennedy) a folder telling of the many uncanny coincidence between the two presidents lives and deaths along with stats about the Kennedy half dollar
- 4.) Rick A. (British Cartwheel) the 1797 two ounce, 41 mm copper two pence that was the first British piece made on a steam press - the inscription was incuse i.e. punched into the metal
- 5.) Terry Cr. (Battle of Lake Erie) History of the Battle and United States Navy Commodore Oliver Hazard Perry, the 2013 Victory Quarter, Battle of Lake Erie's 150th anniversary So-called Half Dollar and famous Battle medals of the event
- 6.) Daniel U. (Slovakia Piece) showing of 1941 20 Korun (Crown) coin, telling of the double cross variety of the year and showing copy of the 20 Crown (pre-Euro) note
